

Jenny's Story

On February 3, 2019, my daughter, Jennifer Irigoyen, and her unborn baby, my grandson, Evan, were brutally murdered. We waited three long years for justice to be served in a court of law and it was finally so on January 25, 2022, when Anthony Hobson was found guilty on all counts, and sentenced to 26 1/3 years to life, on February 17, 2022.

I started this foundation to get through the anguish of profound grief. It's mission was not initially clear or well planned. I was in a state of despair and hopelessness and I had lost faith in the criminal justice system and it's lengthy, arduous, painful process, mostly for victims of crime. I had lived with and around Domestic Violence all my life, but I rarely spoke openly about it. My daughter's tragic death triggered feelings and memories that I had been conditioned to keep secret. I realized that it was time to have a conversation about Domestic Violence, rather than hiding behind the silent walls of secrecy to protect our abusers. Domestic Violence is the elephant in the room, and it is passed from generation to generation, and it ultimately took the life of my only child and her unborn baby.

I recognize how critical a role awareness and education play in addressing this. I vow to do everything I can to let other Domestic Violence survivors know that they are not alone. This is my pledge and promise to my daughter, Jenny, so that she may not have died in vain.
